Acute Rehabilitation

Intensive physical, occupational, and speech therapy helps to restore a child to optimal functioning levels following a catastrophic illness or injury. This program addresses:

- » Hearing/Visual Impairments
- » Spasticity Management

Acute Medical Care

Services are provided for children whose ability to breathe has been compromised and are dependent on a tracheostomy and/or mechanical ventilation. Ventilators used have the latest modes of ventilation for ease of breathing and were chosen for portability. Monitoring of vital signs is available from the bedside to the nurse's station to manage the most complex cases. ICU step down is also available. This level of care is also for children who are medically stable and no longer need neonatal or pediatric intensive care, but require ongoing intense monitoring and complex medical management, due to, but not limited to pulmonary and/or cardiac conditions, brain injury, infectious disease, neurological, and metabolic disorders. Ongoing assessment is provided for:

The goal is to integrate complex medical care while providing normalcy and the best quality of life possible for parents wishing to transition their child home. This program provides:
